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## Vowels：Svara

The sounds of the Sanksrit alphabet are divided among the different places in the mouth；a and $\bar{a}$ are pronounced in the throat， i and $\overline{1}$ at the palate， u and $\overline{\mathrm{u}}$ with the lips， r and $\overline{\mathrm{r}}$ with the tongue curled upward at the roof of the mouth，$!$ and $\overline{1}$ at the teeth，e at the palate，ai sliding from throat to palate，o at the lips，au sliding from throat to lips，and aḥ at the throat．（ă is a nasal sound）

अT－à，pronounced like＂a＂in＂father，＂
इ — i，pronounced like＂$i$＂in＂$i t$＂or＂pin，＂
ई－$\overline{1}$ ，pronounced like＂ i ＂in＂police，＂

## The Ka-varga

These velar consonants are all pronounced in the throat.
क - k , pronounced like the " k " in "sky,"
ख् — kh, pronounced like "c" in "cat,"
J - g , pronounced like the " g " in "gum,"
घ- gh, pronounced like the "gh" in "doghouse,"
S• - n, pronounced like "ng" in "sung,"

## The Ca-varga

These palatal consonants are all pronounced at the palate.
च्- c, pronounced like the "ch" in "church,"
छ्ट-ch, pronounced like the "ch" in "chew,"
ज् - j, pronounced like "j" in "jump,"
戸- jh, pronounce this like " j " with a strong outward breath,"
J- $n$, pronounced like " $n$ " in "canyon,"

## The ta-varga

These retroflex consonants are all pronounced with the tip of the tongue curled upward touching the roof of the mouth.

己 — t , pronounced like the " t " in "art" or "stop,"
ठ — th, pronounced like the "th" in "boathouse,"
ड — d, pronounced like "d" in "ardent" or "bird,"
ढ- $\mathrm{C} h$, pronounce this like "dh" in "hardhat,"
TI — ṇ, pronounced like " $n$ " in "yarn," "land" or "tint,"

## The ta-varga

These dental consonants are all pronounced at the teeth.
त् - t, pronounced like the "th" in "the," "them" or the french word "tete (head),

थ - th, pronounced like the above letter ' $t$ ', but with more aspiration,

द् —d, pronounced like in the french word "donner" (to give),
ध- - dh, pronounce this like "d" with a strong outward breath,
न् - n, pronounced like "n" in "no,"

## The pa-varga

These labial consonants are all pronouced with the lips.

## The Semivowels

The sounds are divided thus; y is produced at the palate, r at the roof of the mouth, $l$ at the teeth, and $v$ at the lips.

य- y, pronounced like the "y" in "yoga,"
₹ —r, pronounced like the " $r$ " in "relic,"
ल- - 1 , pronounced like "l" in "land,"
व् — v, pronounced like "v" in "vote,"

## The Sibilants

The sounds are divided thus; ś is produced at the palate, $s$ at the roof of the mouth, s at the teeth, and h at the throat.

TI - st, pronounced like the "sh" in "Swedish-chocolate,"
ष् - s, pronounced with tongue curled upward touching the roof of the mouth,
स् - s, pronounced like "s" in "sun,"
ह् -h , pronounced like " h " in "house,"
